

TOXIC FOOD & PLANTS TO YOUR DOG

Are you aware of how many plants, common household items and foods are poisonous to our furry four-legged friends?

With varying side effects and symptoms, it is well worthwhile knowing what could make your pup poorly and how to act if you suspect they have been poisoned.

- ⊗ Apple Seeds
- ⊗ Avocado
- ⊗ Onions, Garlic & Chives
- ⊗ Chocolate (theobromine)
- ⊗ Macadamia
- ⊗ Corn on the Cob
- ⊗ Xylitol (common sweetener)
- ⊗ Cooked Bones.
- ⊗ Grapes and Raisins



WHAT TO DO IF YOU THINK YOUR DOG HAS EATEN SOMETHING POISONOUS...

Consult your vet immediately. They may ask you to monitor them, ask for further details or ask you to bring them straight in. Poisoning can effect a dog rapidly, so it is important to act quickly. Do not try to make your dog sick and if they have drunk a chemical do not give them water unless you know that it will not cause a chemical reaction making your dog even more unwell.
